Don't Understand the Worship Service? If it is your first time, some things may seem foreign. Worship does not come naturally; we must be trained to worship God. The first hour on a new job you cannot understand everything about the job. The first hour in a foreign country you do not know its language or its customs. The liturgy is the special activity of the baptized people of God. It has its own customs like we do in our families. Every Sunday we learn the language of worship - or more accurately, the Divine Service -- and what it means to have faith and know God. The liturgy of the service is the place where God reveals Himself to us and gives us His gifts and blessings. It is the place where we learn who God is and how to respond to His gifts with faith and knowledge of Him. Its words come from the Scripture (most of it quoted word for word) and it has been used in the Church for nearly two-thousand years. So don't worry if it all seems strange. You will learn it by practicing -- by being here in the Lord's house every week, hearing His word and coming to His holy table.

Children are welcome in our services! Holy Cross is a church family and we believe that like any family we learn by doing things together. We encourage parents to guide their children throughout the service, helping them to learn the language of the faith through the liturgy.

The Lord Jesus Comes in Humility to Redeem Us

The season of Advent focuses on the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and this first Sunday establishes this theme for the rest of the season. The Son of God came long ago to be our Savior, “*a righteous Branch*” descended from David (Jer. 33:15). As He then came into Jerusalem, riding on a lowly donkey to sacrifice Himself for the sins of the world (Luke 19:28–40), so does He come to His Church today in the humility of Word and Sacrament to deliver the fruits of His Passion: the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. He absolves us and establishes our hearts “*blameless in holiness before our God and Father*” (1 Thess. 3:13). The same Lord Jesus, who came to Jerusalem then and who comes to us now in peace, will come again with power and great glory on the Last Day. Then there will be “*distress of nations in perplexity,*” with “*people fainting with fear.*” Yet, as we anticipate that great and terrible day, He bids us to rest securely in Him: “*Raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near*” (Luke 21:25, 26, 28).

About Covid Restrictions



Deaconess Pamela is planning a trip to Kenya in January 2022. She will be working with the deaconesses of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya.

With each trip she brings along the saints at Holy Cross! She would appreciate your prayers as she prepares for this trip. Also, if you would like to contribute to the mercy work in a tangible way, here's how you can help:

Water Filters

She also hopes to bring 100 water filters to distribute. These filters can provide safe drinking water for up to ten people a day. \$50 will buy a filter and bucket, plus the necessary training for folks to use and maintain the system properly.

First Aid Supplies

The deaconesses of the Evangelical Church in Kenya have requested first aid kits. Supplies will be purchased in Kenya and assembled there. (This helps the Kenyan economy! And my suitcases will be filled with water filters.

Persons in Need

On each and every trip, Deaconess Pamela has encountered Christ's poor and suffering ones. Having extra funds on hand allows for help with the basics of life: food, medical care, housing, etc.
